PRESIDENT KIP SAYS

HAPPY NEW YEAR! HERE'S HOPING THAT 1983 BRINGS US ALL BIGGER SCORES, FEWER DUPES AND, MOST IMPORTANT, AN INCREASED SENSE OF SATISFACTION AND FUN FROM CONTESTING AND FROM THE NCCC.

Over the past several months, a number of NCCC ers have voiced their concern OVER SEVERAL ISSUES RELATING TO THE CLUB WHICH REVOLVE AROUND THE ANSWERS TO TWO QUESTIONS: WHERE IS THE NCCC HEADED AND WHAT KIND OF CLUB SHOULD IT BE? IN MY VIEW, THESE ARE QUESTIONS FOR THE GROUP AS A WHOLE, NOT JUST THE HAND-FUL OF OFFICERS AND DIRECTORS. IT'S NO SECRET THAT MANY NCCC'ERS ACTIVE IN THE CLUB'S AFFAIRS DURING THE PAST TWO OR THREE YEARS HAVE GROWN WEARY OF DOING ALL THE WORK AND HAVE ELECTED TO TAKE INDEFINITE SABBATICALS. IN MOST ORGANIZATIONS WORTH THEIR SALT, THIS WOULD PRODUCE A RUSH OF "NEW BLOOD", READY AND EAGER TO FILL THE VOID. WITH A FEW NOTABLE EXCEPTIONS, THE NCCC HAS NOT BEEN SO LUCKY. THE FEW WHO "RUN" THE CLUB OFTEN FIND THAT GETTING "VOL-UNTEERS" IS MORE TIME-CONSUMING THAN SIMPLY DOING THE JOB THEMSELVES. THUS, WE FACE A SITUATION NOW WHERE A FEW DO ALL THE WORK, LESS THAN ONE-FOURTH OF THE CLUB'S MEMBERS REGULARLY ATTEND MEETINGS OR OTHERWISE PARTICIPATE IN THE Club's activities, and overall enthusiasm and interest are down.

So what to do? Maybe nothing. The NCCC has seen peaks and valleys of this SORT IN THE PAST AND HAS SURVIVED - - OR, INDEED, HAS FLOURISHED. BUT IT SEEMS TO ME THAT THE ISSUES AT LEAST NEED TO BE AIRED BY THE CLUB AS A WHOLE.

1982 CALIFORNIA QSO PARTY

Fifteen new California county records, eight new state records, increased participation, good conditions, good scores -- and fewer logs received. That, in a word (or several) sums up this year's CQP.

This year's California winner was Gary Caldwell, WA6VEF. With last year's winner, Tree, N6TR, sitting this one out, Gary operated N6BT to within 12 QSO's of setting a new all-time single op record. Congratulations: The out-of-state battle again pitted Mike, WDØEWD, against Scott, WAØAVL. The scores were so close that both logs were completely duped by computer (with many thanks to Phil, K6ZM) to determine the winner. Congratulations to WAØAVL, who prevailed by 426 points -- 4 fewer QSO's than WDØEWD but one more multiplier. The California DXpedition winner was the more-or-less multi-multi operation of NJ6D from Placer County. (By the way, the tri-bander used is now under six feet of snow at Lake Tahoe, making an all-out Placer County effort in 1983 somewhat less than certain.)

This contest gets tougher each year -- all top 10 California single ops found all 58 multipliers this year. Making the top 10 single op listing was much more difficult this year if you were in California (153K this year vs. 139K last year for #10) but easier if you were not (21.3K vs. 32K).

Thanks to all who participated this year. A special thanks to the mobiles and county expeditions who make a special effort each year to activate the hard-to-work California counties.

Several participants suggested rule changes or clarifications. Each of these will be considered by the NCCC Board of Directors at an early meeting and, if implemented, will appear in the announcement of the 1983 CQP to be mailed to all who submitted logs this year.

Take a look at the all-time records reprinted later in this report. There are many state and county records waiting to be claimed and they can be yours -- get on in 1983 and do it.


