In the end nothing that was too bad but some very annoying things in the first six hours was really trying my patience.

Great efforts by many folks. K9CT and K7RAT(N6TR) have some great scores. And NR4L seems to be doing well in this new hobby and in contesting in a short period of time.

K9CT was making me work to catch up with him. I am glad he decided to take time off to go eat. I am pretty sure if he did the whole contest he would have a higher score than me. All day today - 10m was mostly not open to Southern California. Making moves from 10 to 15 did not work very well for the closer stations. There were a number that I kept seeing on CW that I could not hear or barely hear all day. Many of them I never did work. Being just a bit further away sure helps with that signal footprint into all of California.

In the months and weeks and even in the last few days and really hours before this contest I was not sure if I would do assisted or unassisted. Not sure when I decided to do it - but it was really in the hour or so before the contest. All of my efforts in the CQP have been unassisted. The assisted category is fairly new to the CQP. But I figured I would give it a go. Being out of state in this contest you have to call CQ on SSB to put in a big score - and you just do not get much in the way of answers on CW. Also one of the ways to increase your score is to move all the casual folks that call in to one or more additional bands because there are a



limited number (even if it is large) of stations to work in California. As an unassisted op you have to call CQ on SSB on two bands and move folks between them. This makes it really hard to also tune the CW bands and works folks - there is always this tension between SSB on both radios or one on CW looking for new stations - and after you work the bulk of them on CW your rate for tuning CW is never going to match your rate of just moving every person you work on SSB to at least one other band so your CW totals suffer. What I found as assisted is that I could 'monitor' the CW bands for new stations because anyone that calls CQ on CW gets spotted by the CW skimmers and so you never miss anyone - and it is a quick trip to go pick them off all day Sunday - this did wonders for my CW totals that are usually in the ~300 range at most as an unassisted op. It was interesting.

I did manage to make one error - and that was that it appears that I set up filters on the DX node I was using to just show me skimmer spots. I was thinking that there sure were not any SSB spots and that either my logging software or something was just not working right. DUH. I feel stupid - but I am not sure it hurt me much - maybe I would have worked more SSB on 80 and 160. Who knows.

I had a good time but I think I like doing unassisted better in this contest and in most contests so I am not sure I will do this again in the CQP. I like having to tune the bands. And I did a fair amount of that on SSB this weekend anyway.
